Two days hands on training on "Aquaculture technologies" under TSP for the farmers of Sardar Sarovar, Nandurbar district, Maharashtra 22-23 January, 2020, Nandurbar

ICAR- Central Institute of Fisheries Education, Mumbai in collaboration with Department of Fisheries, Govt of Maharashtra organised a two days hands on training on **Aquaculture technologies** at Manibeli village, Sardar Sarovar, Distt. Nandurbar, Maharashtra for the farmers during 22-23 January, 2020. 47 tribal farmers from five different villages (viz Shelgada, Chickhodi, Manibeli, Bhusa and Chimalkhedi) of Nandurbar district participated in the programme.
