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General Guidelines

- (i) The persons who have received this award previously are not eligible to apply again.
- (ii) Interested scientists shall apply through the Head of the Organization in the prescribed application form (using Annexure-I) available on the CIFE website (www.cife.edu.in). The application shall be neatly typed, duly certified, signed and forwarded through the proper channel.
- (iii) The relevant period of reporting and consideration for the awards would be from 01.04.2019 to 31.03.2022 (three years) for 2022.
- (iv) The filled-in Application Form by the Young Scientist (**Age: Below 40 years as on 31st March 2022**) should be sent as a mail attachment to the **Director, ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, (Deemed University), Panch Marg, Off Yari Road, Versova, Andheri (West), Mumbai – 400 061** **in soft copy only on or before 25.06.2022 in mail ID (endowaward@cife.edu.in).**
- (v) ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, Mumbai will contribute towards the travelling expenses of Scientist selected for the award at a rate corresponding to the amount of AC 3-Tier railway fare by the shortest route to the place from the Railway Station nearest to the place of residence of the Scientist.

- (vi) Each candidate will be judged based on the originality and/or the applied value of the research work/ investigations as revealed in the supporting documents submitted by him/her. In all matters relating to the award, the decision of the ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, Mumbai shall be final, and no correspondence on this account will be entertained.
