This award will be called “**Prof. Ravindranath Krothapalli Best Ph.D. Thesis Award**”. A Gold Medal and a Citation will be awarded to one of the students receiving Ph.D. Degree from CIFE, Mumbai for the year 2022. This Award is meant to reward talent, encourage and inspire budding research scholars to further excel and contribute to the growth of fisheries sciences.

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General Guidelines:

- (i) The students already honoured with this Award are not eligible to apply again.
- (ii) Interested students shall apply through the Head of Division/Centre/Section in the prescribed application form available at the Director’s Cell/ Heads of Divisions/ SICs of Centre’s/ Director of the Institute/ Dean of Fisheries College. The application shall be neatly typed, duly certified, signed and forwarded through proper channel. The application form is available on the CIFE website <https://www.cife.edu.in/>.
- (iii) The relevant period of reporting and consideration would be for Ph.D. Degree awarded between 01.04.2021 to 31.03.2022 for this Award of 2022.
- (iv) The filled-in Application Form should be sent as a mail attachment to the **Director, ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, (Deemed University), Panch Marg, Off Yari Road, Versova, Andheri (West), Mumbai – 400 061** **in soft Copy only on or before 25.06.2022 in mail ID (endowaward@cife.edu.in)**.
- (v) Looking into Covid-19 situation in Mumbai, the award shall be given on a suitable date, which shall be intimated well in advance.
- (vi) ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, Mumbai will contribute towards the travelling expenses of student selected for the award at a rate corresponding to the amount of 2nd Class/ Sleeper Mail/ Express Railway Fare by the shortest route to the place from the Railway Station nearest to the normal place of residence of the student or from where he/she actually performs the journey, whichever, is nearer to the CIFE, Mumbai, and back to the same station or the amount of Railway fare actually incurred by the student

whichever is less provided he/she fulfill all the conditions. No student from Mumbai local will be paid travel allowance in any case.

- (vii) Each candidate will be judged based on the originality and/or the applied value of the research work/ investigations as revealed in the documents submitted by him/her. In all matters relating to this Award, the decision of the ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, Mumbai shall be final, and no correspondence on this account will be entertained.
