Breakthrough in Pacific White Shrimp Farming

Dr. S. Ayyappan, Secretary, DARE and Director General, ICAR, inaugurated the first harvesting of the Pacific Shrimp *L. vannamei* at Rohtak Centre of CIFE on September 5, 2012. The **Director General** was accompanied by **Dr. B. Meena Kumari**, *DDG (Fy.)*, **Dr. Madan Mohan**, *ADG (Marine Fy.)*. **Dr. W. S. Lakra**, Director, CIFE welcomed the team and apprised them about the new initiatives on breakthrough achievement in the culture of *L. vannamei at Rohtak Centre*.

The culture of L. vannamei in inland saline soils using ground saline water at Baniyani Farm, Lahli, Rohtak, Haryana with a salinity of 13-15 ppt is the first attempt by the Institute in the country towards utilizing degraded land. The ground water at the Baniyani farm is deficient in potassium and was fortified with commercial fertilizer Murate of Potash to a level of 50-60% of natural sea water potassium and L. vannamei was stocked at the rate 60 Nos. / m² (6.0 lakhs/ha) on 21st May, 2012 and grown to an average size of 23.5 g in 120 days and achieved a production of 8.10 ton/0.60 ha(13.5 ton/ha). The Director General reviewed the programs of the Centre and provided several new ideas including the culture of Penaeus indicus. The results of the present demonstration will boost the inland saline aquaculture and species diversification in degraded lands in a big way which in turn will provide self-employment and livelihood to rural men and women.

A field visit—cum-practical training was arranged for 30 M.F.Sc students of Aquaculture, FRM, PHT, Fisheries Economics and Extension Divisions to MAYANK AQUACULTURE PRIVATE LIMITED, SURAT, in the month of June, 2012 as part of the practical lessons for major course Coastal Aquaculture, (AQ 506). The farm is a brainchild of Dr. Manoj Sharma, Director (an alumnus of CIFE), who has spearheaded shrimp farming in the barren unproductive lands of Hajira, Surat, Gujarat.

Regional Workshop on

"Expert Consultation on Academic Partnership for Excellence and Networks in Fisheries Education and Research"



An expert consultation on academic partnership for excellence and networks in fisheries education research was organised at the Kolkata Centre on 23rd April 2012 at Science City auditorium, Kolkata. The meeting started with a formal welcome address by Dr. B. K. Mahapatra Officer In-Charge, CIFE, Kolkata Centre and it was inaugurated by Prof. C. S. Chakrabarti, Vice-Chancellor, WB University of Animal & Fishery Sciences, President, IAU. Dr. W. S. Lakra, Director/Vice-Chancellor, CIFE, Mumbai welcomed the participants from the eastern region. He expressed his desire to develop linkages with different agencies and universities, while acknowledging the contribution of zoology departments, different labs of central agencies in the region. The purpose of forging such kind of linkages is to bring excellence in fisheries science. Quality education, quality human resource in fisheries, exchange programmes and sharing of farm facilities, lab equipments, expertise and development of succeeding lines after superannuation of experts are some of the key areas which were discussed. In view of the next plan period which was declared as decade of biodiversity, the institute aims to address

national agenda, develop strategies, new courses, innovation in teaching methods and collaborative research. He urged all the participants to aim for development of world class institutions with global ratings.

Prof. C. S. Chakrabarti, V.C., WBUA&FS in his address emphasized the need to develop linkages among different institutions especially agricultural universities to put to use the resources for development of the sector. He mentioned that for growing of fish we need water bodies. But most of the water bodies are polluted and declining due to Climate change and other factors. Under these circumstances, whenever a curriculum is devised for fishery students we should keep these issues in mind. He urged that research component of an Institution should not be based on mandate rather it should be an open system.

Dr. C. S. Purushothaman, Dean, Academics, CIFE, Mumbai described about the genesis of such programmes in view of limited interactions, diversified efforts and the need to bridge the gap of divergence. The main purpose is to bring

the traditional universities and agricultural Universities under one umbrella for the development of fisheries education. He emphasized that some areas of fisheries need urgent attention and one of the purpose of the meeting is to search leaders who can take the responsibilities in specific areas.

Prof. Amalesh Choudhary, Dr. B. N. Pandey, Dr. U. C. Goswami lauded Dr. Lakra for his good initiative. Prof. Choudhary stressed upon the need to collaborate between maritime states with reference to coastal aquaculture, fish and shell fish fauna, development of climate resilient aquaculture in face of climate change.

Dr. W. S. Lakra, Director/Vice-Chancellor, CIFE, Mumbai mooted the idea to conduct writeshops and publish good laboratory manuals for fisheries students and carry out high quality research work. The discussions were held on topics of future of traditional knowledge, food

security, fish medicine by tribal, ICT usage and quality teaching. The participants also expressed the need to have Dean's committee to streamline the nomenclature of departments in fisheries colleges and publish a journal on fisheries/agriculture education. Dr. A. K. Roy, former professor, College of Fisheries, Agartala stressed the need to evolve the Biology of 21st century by incorporating bioinformatics in syllabus. There is also the need to draw up a list of teachers with special expertise like plankton identification. Prof. Viswanath mentioned about the importance of fish physiology studies with emphasis on energetics and nutrition in view of climate change. At the end, Dr. W.S. Lakra, Director, Vice Chancellor, CIFE thanked everybody for contributing to the meeting and invited the participants to come out with plans, proposals for quality enhancement fisheries research and education in India.
