## Proceedings of Annual General Body Meeting of Indian Fisheries Association, Mumbai

The Annual General Body (AGM) of the Indian Fisheries Association (IFA) was held on 18.10.2022 at Room no. 319, ICAR-CIFE, Mumbai from 3.00 pm in hybrid mode. Dr. C. N. Ravishankar, Director, CIFE and President, IFA welcomed all the Members. He profusely thanked all the Members for their contributions in making and shaping the IFA over the years. He requested all the Members to proactively plan and conduct various programmes and takeIFA to greater heights. He also sought suggestions and ideas from all the Members to increase the Membership especially by enrolling all the Masters and PhD students, mobilise resources initiate innovative programs, and make the IFA more vibrant.

Dr. K. Pani Prasad, Secretary, IFA presented the reports for the years 2021-22, 2020-21, 2019-20 and 2018-19. He mentioned that due to COVID the meetings and programmes could not been undertaken. The present total no. of members are 620 and requested all members to support for more memberships. The major activity undertaken was in association with ICAR- CIFE was The 3<sup>rd</sup> International Symposium on Aquaculture and Fisheries Education at CIFE, Mumbai during 16-18 May 2018. The programme was a huge success with the participation of 260 delegates including 15 international delegates from Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Thailand, Ethiopia, France, Nigeria and Bhutan. As per the agreement with Asian Fisheries Society, Central Institute of Fisheries Education and IFA, for conduct of ISAFE3, an amountequivalent to US\$ 15,000/- (US dollors fifteen thousand only) has been paid to Asian FisheriesSociety. The Chief Guest for inaugural programme for ISAFE3 was Padma Vibhushan Dr. Anil Khakodkar, Advisor, Government of India, and the Guest of Honours were Shri Mahadev Jankhar, AH & AH and Fisheries Minister, Government of Maharashtra, Dr. J. K. Jena, DDG (Fy), ICAR, New Delhi and Dr. C. Virapat, DG, NACA, Thailand. The Chief Guest for valedictory programme was Dr. T. Mohapatra, DG (ICAR) and Secretary (DARE), New Delhi. The book of abstracts, Souvenir and Proceedings of the Symposium were released. The salient activities were highlighted as the AGM could not be held during the pandemic years.

Dr. Neelam Saharan, Treasurer, IFA presented the Audited Reports and the fund position.

Dr. Kiran Dube and Dr. A. K. Jaiswar informed regarding the status of the Journal of IFA (JIFA). It was stated that the present NAAS rating of the journal which is 4.14, is likely to be revised upwards

during the forthcoming revision. They also stated that the papers for Volumes 48 (1) and 48 (2) were ready for printing.

The decisions taken at the EC meeting held on 1<sup>st</sup> Sept. 2022 namely increasing the membership fees of IFA from Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 2000/-, making the first or corresponding author as the member of IFA for publishing papers in IFA journal, bringing out Special issues of the journal by requesting eminent researches for their contributions, and making efforts to have a separate website for IFA and making the database of the Members of IFA and uploading in the website were all ratified in the AGM. Thereafter, Members of the IFA gave suggestions for mobilisation of resources, range of programs and activities that could be conducted by IFA, and also the ways to improve the reach, visibility, impact and rating of the JIFA.

The Elections for various positions of the IFA Executive Council, other than the President, were held and following was decided. All the Members were elected unanimously. The elected members are for the period from 18<sup>th</sup> October 2022 to 17<sup>th</sup> October, 2025.
